1974 - 1989

Harry Mellanby was the Clerk of the former Street Urban District Council prior to the formation of Mendip District Council and Street Parish Council in 1974. He then became Assistant Chief Executive of the District Council and Clerk of the Parish Council.





LINDA RUFF 1989 - 2023

Linda Ruff was appointed as the Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer of Street Parish Council from 1st April 1989. She retired on 30th April 2023 after 34 years of service.

Linda had previously worked for nearly 10 years as a committee officer at Mendip District Council. Initially she worked part-time from home with meetings being held in the Library. In 2005 the Council decided to lease Room 20 on the first floor of the Crispin Community Centre for meetings and as an office. It was later agreed to purchase the Parish Rooms and the Council operated from that building from December 2010 following extensive refurbishment. In 2018 the County Council proposed to close Street Library and after careful consideration it was agreed to move the Library to the ground floor of the Parish Rooms. The Parish Council office and meeting rooms were moved to the first floor and further alterations were carried out to the building in 2020.
